HIS HONOUR: In this matter provisional liquidators were appointed as a matter of urgency since it was apprehended by the applicant, a director and shareholder of Ansavah, that a substantial company asset, a yacht, was about to be removed from the jurisdiction by her estranged husband, the other director and shareholder.

Subsequently the yacht was arrested in Darwin. No steps have been taken by anyone to release the yacht which is valued at 180,000 to \$185,000 on the material before me. It apparently was transferred from the company name to the husband's name in July of this year shortly before the application for winding up was made.

The application for winding up has been served on the company at its registered address. The provisional liquidators have disclosed that the company has few assets, leaving the yacht out of account, and a debt of a value equivalent to the estimated value of the yacht to the Australian Taxation Office.

Other trade creditors, according to the material, are estimated at \$10,000 to \$12,000. There is a claim that there is a balance owed to the husband of about \$57,000. The Registrar has given a certificate in accordance with local practice as to compliance with the requirements for the winding up. The application rests on the general grounds and the just and equitable ground.
