Edmonton Memorial Bowls Club Incorporated, which is an
incorporated association pursuant to the Associations
Incorporation Act of 1981.

A provisional liquidator was appointed voluntarily by the
management committee on the 10th of September 2002. The
management committee of the association now petitions the
Court for the winding up of the association, based on the fact
that the association is unable to pay its debts. Evidence
before me shows that a total indebtedness to a variety of
creditors in the sum of \$69,486.98 has been revealed, though
further inquiries are being undertaken by the provisional
liquidator to establish whether this is the true extent of the
indebtedness of the association.

The application is made pursuant to section 90, subsection 2
of the Associations Incorporation Act and sections 582 of the
Corporation Act.

The circumstances are such that it is proper for the
association to be wound up in the circumstances where it has
ceased trading, is unable to pay its debts and is unlikely to
be able to fulfil the objects of the association. The
Registrar's certificate has been read which certifies to the
compliance with the various rules associated with the process
of winding-up.
